GENERAL SERVICE ELECTRIC HEATING (DEMAND CONTROLLED)
(Schedule "GSEHDC")

AVAILABILITY:

Available only for normal domestic light and power use to individual residences, individual dwelling units, and individual apartments within the Utility's service area and who have a minimum 30-gallon electric water heater and the primary heating source is electric for the entire home. Service under this schedule is not available for master-metered multiple housing units, business establishments, or public buildings. Service under this schedule requires special metering equipment and an automatic demand control device.

CHARACTER OF SERVICE:

Alternating current, 60 Hertz, at available secondary voltages.

NET RATE PER BILLING PERIOD: (or part thereof/service)

\$24.75 per billing period (System Charge)

All kWh per billing period @ \$0.049/kWh

All kW per billing period @ \$10.00 /kW



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ANNUAL RATE/YEAR:

Upon request of the consumer and for his convenience, the Utility will render one bill annually payable in advance. The annual charges will be estimated by the Utility based on billing period minimum rate charges, established contracts, or on prior years' usage. If prior years' usage is utilized, the average annual prior years' usage shall be divided by 12 and allocated to each future billing period.

For the first 11 billing periods, a system charge of \$24.75 per billing period per service plus the above kWh usage. The calculated bill will be subtracted from the consumer's prepaid balance. The twelfth billing period shall be an adjusted bill consisting of the \$24.75 system charge plus the kWh charge adjustment to the consumer's actual annual usage.

MINIMUM CHARGES:

The minimum charges per billing period shall be the highest of the following:

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charge shall be in addition to the system charge of \$24.75 (no kW allowance in system charge).

(4) Minimum charges established by special contract between the consumer and the Utility.

Any capacity and energy allowances shall be made only during the billing period in which they occurred.

DEBT COST ADJUSTMENT:

Billing under this schedule may be increased or decreased by an amount in the cost of debt capital incurred pursuant to securities, the issuance of which has been approved by the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission, of the debt cost utilized to establish these rates. This is in accordance with New Mexico Public Regulation Commission Code of Rules and Regulations No. 540.

FUEL AND PURCHASED POWER COST ADJUSTMENT:

The utility shall, if the fuel and purchased power expense is increased or decreased above or below the base purchased power cost of \$.0626398/kWh sold, flow through to the users such increases or decreases, in accordance with New Mexico Public Regulation Commission Rule No. 550 (17.9.550 NMAC).

TAX ADJUSTMENT:


Billing under this schedule may be increased by an amount equal to the sum of the taxes payable under the Gross Receipts and Compensating Tax Act and of all other

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taxes, fees, or charges (exclusive of Ad Valorem, State and Federal Income Taxes) payable by the Utility and levied or assessed by any governmental authority on the public utility service rendered, or on the right or privilege of rendering the service, or on any object or event incidental to the rendition of the service.

TERMS OF PAYMENT:

All bills are net and payable within 20 days from the date of bill.

BILLING PERIOD:

The billing period shall be approximately 1/12 of a year but not necessarily a calendar month.

BUDGET BILLING:

Upon the request of the consumer and for his convenience, the Utility will provide budget billing in accordance with the rules and regulations filed by the Utility and approved by the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission.

TEMPORARY OR UNUSUAL SERVICE:


Temporary or unusual service will be covered by the Utility's Rules and Regulations. In such cases, the minimum charges, condition of furnishing substation equipment, connection and disconnection of service and special conditions will be covered by special agreement with the customer. The customer shall pay for all expenses involved in furnishing temporary service.

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SERVICE CHARGE:

A service charge of one and one-half percent (1 & 1/2%) per billing period or fraction thereof will be charged on all utility service bills and invoices which are delinquent per the provisions of the tariff.

TEMPORARY OR UNUSUAL SERVICE:

Temporary or unusual service will be covered by the Utility's Rules and Regulations. In such cases, the minimum charges, conditions of furnishing substation equipment, connection and disconnection of service and special conditions will be covered by special agreement with the customer. The customer shall pay for all expenses involved in furnishing the temporary service.

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE:


- (1) The Utility's Rules and Regulations, filed with the regulatory body shall apply.
- (2) All wiring, pole lines and other electrical equipment on the load side of the metering point shall be considered the distribution system of the consumer and shall be furnished and maintained by the consumer.
- (3) The consumer's installation shall conform to City, State and National Electrical Codes and Electrical Safety Codes.
- (4) The consumer shall not resell or share electric service with others.
- (5) Special conditions of service shall be covered by contract.

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
