**75.00/per destination**

### **Stretcher**

**\$199.00/per destination**

**\$4.00/loaded mile**

**\$50.00 Oxygen fee over over 60 miles**

### **Wait Time**

**\$50.00/hour after 1st hour**

**All miles calculated during client loaded transport distance only**

### **Points and Places: Statewide- New Mexico**

**Pursuant to New Mexico Public Regulation Commission 18.3 .6 NMSA 1978, 65-2A and 21, Acute Rescue is hereby submitting its proposed tariff as required. This Tariff governs rates for statewide, non-emergency medical transport services per Medicaid Transportation Policy for covered services and service limitations. Vehicles will be used to transport clients only. The physician must attest to the need for an attendant in writing. Mileage will only be calculated and documented during client loaded transport. Modifiers identify origin and destination of transport.**

### **General Provisions:**

- Acute Rescue will attempt to maintain schedules, but will not be liable for delays caused by unforeseen circumstances beyond our control, such as weather conditions, icy/muddy roads or roadside accident and/or closures.**
- Acute Rescue will not be responsible for damaged, lost or stolen items.**
- Acute Rescue will not transport animals, however, service dogs accompanying patients will be accepted.**
- Acute Rescue reserves the right to refuse to transport a person or persons under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs, or who is incapable of taking care of himself or herself, or who shows conduct which is such, or is likely to be such, as to make him or her objectionable to drivers or passengers.**

**The above rule does not apply to an ill person accompanied by an attendant or care provider.**
